WHAT WE DO

Mixed Company Theatre facilitates workshops and presentations of Forum Theatre – an UNESCO– recognized educational tool – to engage, educate and empower audiences in schools, communities, and workplaces.


This high impact and participatory form of theatre is known for its effectiveness in helping students tackle issues that directly affect them. Forum Theatre offers students an opportunity to "rehearse for reality" and try out their own solutions for positive change.

WHAT IS FORUM THEATRE?

In a typical Forum Theatre play, a story representing a social issue is created and performed by actors. Students are then invited onto the stage by a trained facilitator to enact an "intervention" where they can either replace a character or suggest a change to the story to result in a positive, alternative ending.

Through open and supportive Forum Theatre facilitation, students are able to share and explore strategies with one another in a safe artistic environment.


